<ul> <li>spring was time for military battle (1)</li> <li>Joab - hired fighters and Israel's army (1)</li> <li>David stayed home instead of going into battle (1)</li> <li>Bathsheba - daughter of Eliam - one of David's mighty men (3)</li> <li>Grandfather of Bathsheba Ahithophel (15:12; 16:15) - David's counselor</li> <li>Uriah - one of David's mighty men = Uriah was a Hittite - Heb name = the Lord is my Light</li> <li>David makes desperate attempts to get Uriah to go to his home with his wife (6-13)</li> <li>David writes Uriah's death instructions and sends them to Joab by Uriah's hand and he has Uriah killed (14-21)</li> <li>David takes Bathsheba to be his wife (26-27)</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Nathan confronts David of his sin (1)</li> <li>He uses the example of a rich taking the one and only precious sheep from a poor man and killing it (1-4)</li> <li>David's anger burned against this man who took another man's sheep - he deserves to die (5) - he had no compassion (6)</li> <li>Nathan tells David you are this man (7)</li> <li>God has given to David - kingdom, deliverance, Saul's kingdom, united kingdom - He would have added many more things (8)</li> <li>Why have you despised the word of the Lord by doing evil (9) Consequences</li> <li>Sword will never depart from your house (10)</li> <li>Evil will come from within your own house (11)</li> <li>I will take your wives from you and give them to another</li> <li>God will make David's sin and punishment known to all Israel (12)</li> <li>David's response - I have sinned (13)</li> <li>The Lord has taken away your sin - you shall not die</li> <li>Consequences will be severe - so the nations will not blaspheme the Lord (14)</li> <li>The child that is born to you will surely die (14)</li> </ul>
